Girls selected to serve as Girl Representatives for Celebrate Leadership participate in a special event designed to illustrate to the community who we are, what we do, and why it matters.

Nominate a Girl Scout to:

- Represent GSOC as part of an amazing group of girls from all Girl Scout levels Daisy-Ambassador (grade 1-12 in Fall)
- Share personal examples of her Girl Scout leadership story/experience
- Meet and connect with a fantastic group of female community leaders
- Participate in a professional photo shoot
- Receive professional speaking/coaching
- Receive a CEO patch and Celebrate Leadership Girl Representative patch
- Participate in three rehearsals, including one dress rehearsal
- Participate in Celebrate Leadership Event (*date TBD*) in Fall 2017
- Be recognized at the annual GSOC Recognition Event in June
- Be invited to participate in additional leadership opportunities as they arise

How to Nominate

Identify a Girl Scout in grade K-11 who can speak about her Girl Scout story/experience and submit all three nomination forms below by April 15, 2017. You can also find the forms by visiting www.girlscoutsoc.org and clicking on About Girl Scouts, Our Program, Girl Recognition.

1. The [Nominee Form](#) is to be completed **by the girl and/or her parent**. Girl submits an essay or drawing to share what she has achieved because of her participation Girl Scouts, plus a photo and short video describing why she wants to be a Celebrate Leadership Girl Representative.
2. The [Nomination Form](#) is to be completed **by a Girl Scout adult** such as a parent, troop leader, or other Girl Scout volunteer. Nominators should give specific examples of what the girl has achieved because of her participation in Girl Scouting.
3. The [Reference Form](#) is to be completed **by a non-Girl Scout adult** such as a teacher, coach, or religious leader. References should give specific examples of how the girl demonstrates leadership.
