# The Girl Scout Gold Award

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest and most prestigious award in the world for girls.

Open to Girl Scouts in high school, this pinnacle of achievement recognizes girls who demonstrate extraordinary leadership by tackling an issue they are passionate about – Gold Award Girl Scouts are community problem solvers who team up with others to create meaningful change through sustainable and measurable "Take Action" projects they design to make the world a better place.

Since 1916, Girl Scouts have been making meaningful, sustainable changes in their communities and around the world by earning the Highest Award in Girl Scouting. Originally called the Golden Eagle of Merit and later, the Golden Eaglet, Curved Bar, First Class, and now the Girl Scout Gold Award, this esteemed accolade is a symbol of excellence, leadership, and ingenuity, and a testament to what a girl can achieve.

Girl Scouts who earn the Gold Award distinguish themselves in the college admissions process, earn scholarships from a growing number of colleges and universities across the country, and immediately rise one rank in any branch of the U.S. military. Many have practiced the leaderships skills they need to "go gold" by earning the Girl Scout Silver Award, the highest award for Girl Scout Cadettes in grade 6-8, and the Girl Scout Bronze Award, the highest award for Girl Scout Juniors in grades 4-5. In addition, Gold Award Girl Scouts have the opportunity to apply for academic scholarships and recognition as a <u>National Gold Award Girl Scout</u>, an honor given by Girl Scouts of the USA to 10 Gold Award Girl Scouts annually.

Over the years, the Girl Scout Gold Award has inspired nearly 3,000 Orange County Girl Scouts to find greatness within themselves and create sustainable solutions to issues they deeply care about. This year, **108** OC girls earned the Girl Scout Gold Award. These young women join a sisterhood of amazing women who have made a difference locally and globally and Girl Scouts of Orange County salutes these dedicated and determined young women for making the world a better place through their completion of the steps to earn the Girl Scout Gold Award. The outstanding young women featured in this yearbook have demonstrated their courage, confidence, and character by leaving a lasting mark on society, changing the world forever and for better!

She connected with Barbara Murphy of the OCSPCA Canine Literacy Program and implemented the 6 week CLP in Mrs. Gutierrez's 3/4 combo class. This helped students improve oral language skills, fluency, and comprehension. Surveys/reading assessments showed most students had increased confidence reading out loud to their peers after the CLP. Jamie then implemented a K/3rd weekly Reading Buddies program to further build confidence reading aloud, and organized a Mesa Verde Library Dog-Reading Day for community reading resource awareness.



"Throughout my Gold Award, I have developed my leadership skills, communication skills, and have learned how to present myself to varying age groups. I saw the confidence gained from reading to dogs, and now also understand the power of a prize for third graders. The teachers I worked with showed me how to lead with a purpose and with passion. Without the people I worked with, I definitely wouldn't be where I am today."

Elizabeth chose to make Monarch Butterfly waystations for the environment concerns for the Monarch Butterflies and their integral part in our ecosystem. Elizabeth's project objective was to assist the Monarch Butterflies through their migration from Mexico to Canada, and on their way to Canada they need places that they can naturally lay their eggs and eat from milkweed plants. Southern California is a hub for Monarch Butterflies because of the natural growing milkweed and pollinator plants that support the Monarch's diet. Each site where Elizabeth planted Monarch Butterfly waystations, involved a group of different volunteers. Participants learn to build their own waystations during their tenure volunteering. Elizabeth's project will be sustained beyond her involvement because of the generosity of The Monarch Butterfly Society, Bee Club, and Gardening/Ecology Club of the Orange County School of the Arts.

"I learned positive values, gained practical life skills, sought challenges in the world, and developed critical thinking throughout the process of building my Monarch Butterfly Waystations. I gained these leadership skills working hard to produce a waystation that not only is helpful to the environment, but beautifies the natural area. I developed healthy relationships, promoted cooperation/ team building, resolve products, and felt more connected to my community. I developed these skills by trial and error throughout my Gold Award process in every aspect of my project, from finding better paint for the tires to bringing together a variety of people in the community to create these waystations."
