STEM: When Girl Scouts participate in girl-focused STEM programs, they:

- Become better problem solvers, critical thinkers, and inspirational leaders
- Get better grades, earn scholarships, and follow more lucrative career paths
- See STEM as the foundation for a meaningful and successful future



Outdoors: When Girl Scouts get outside, they:

- Discover that they can better solve problems and overcome challenges
- Develop leadership skills, build social bonds, and are happier overall
- Become team players and care more about protecting our environment



Life Skills: When Girl Scouts explore civic engagement, community service, and healthy relationships, they:

- Practice communication and form stronger bonds with family, friends, and their communities
- Foster self-esteem and feel empowered to advocate for themselves and others as they make a difference in the world by "giving service" and taking action
- Learn how to recognize and deal with bullying/relational aggression, develop healthy relationships, make friends, and practice people skills



Entrepreneurship: When Girl Scouts practice entrepreneurship through the Girl Scout Cookie Program, they:

- Gain essential life skills and work as a team to accomplish common goals and solve problems, while building the confidence they need to shine as girls, as young women, and as future leaders
- Develop five lifelong financial literacy and entrepreneurship skills: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics
