Research

Take Notes

Bring a notebook and pencil with you to jot down notes. You do not have to write everything down, just the highlights or information you feel is very important.

Be Courteous

Be on time; it shows that you care and value your interviewee's time. Make eye contact while you are speaking with your interviewee, and always thank them for the opportunity to find out more about their career.

Review

Read your notes after your interview so you remember the conversation.
