

Leader Award

Description:

What is a Leader? A Leader is a volunteer who can empathize, identify strengths, and empower others.

Criteria:

- Volunteer abides by the Girl Scout Promise and Law (at any level, troop helpers, troop leaders, or service unit team members).
- Registered Girl Scout member, successfully completed background screening (where applicable) and completed appropriate training for their volunteer role.
- Volunteer either works directly with girls, adults, or both.
- More than one volunteer can earn each award.
- Volunteers can only be awarded one letter per year but over time can strive to collect all four.

Examples:

- A volunteer who provides ongoing conflict resolution support within the troop or service unit
- A volunteer who empowers and works with girls to take on a leadership role. Such as, emcee a
 ceremony/event, planning and running large event (day camp), or council event.
- A troop volunteer who steps up to be the outdoor trained volunteer for their troop and takes the required outdoor trainings and promotes or helps implement outdoor experiences with in their service unit.
