# Girl Scout Gold Award Getting Started

## Get Ready to Go Gold

All Girl Scouts make the world a better place and every girl in grades 9-12 is eligible to earn the Girl Scout Gold Award. Once a registered Girl Scout has completed two Senior/Ambassador Journeys OR has earned the Silver Award and completed one Senior/Ambassador Journey, 80 hours is the suggested minimum hours for completing the steps to earn the Girl Scout Gold Award:

1. Choose an issue
2. Investigate it thoroughly
3. Get help and build your team
4. Create a plan
5. Present your plan and gather feedback
6. Take action
7. Educated and inspire others

## Share and get feedback on the Project Proposal Before the Interview

The Girl Scout Gold Award Project Proposal Support Meeting gives a girl an opportunity to share their Take Action project plan and get informal input about their Project Proposal.

Girls (and adults: Troop/Group Volunteers, Project Advisors, and Parents/Caregivers welcome) meet with a member of the Girl Scout Gold Award Support Team prior to submitting the Project Proposal using [GoGold](#) and participating in a required council interview. This is a great way for a girl to prepare for the interview where they will have the opportunity to pitch their proposed plan to request approval for her Gold Award Take Action Project.

Participation is optional and does not take the place of the interview. We encourage girls who have completed or are very close to completing the Journey(s) and are ready to focus on the Girl Scout Gold Award Take Action project to attend. Girls should come prepared to share the issue they hope to address and their plan to help solve it; this meeting does not help girls to identify an issue and plan a project.
