GSUSA Medal of Honor & Bronze Cross Lifesaving Awards Open to Girl Scout Daisies to Ambassadors, grades K-12	 Registered Girl Scout age 5 through 17 who saved or attempted to save a life under circumstances that indicate heroism/risk Medal of Honor: Given for saving a life/attempting to save a life without risk to the candidate's own life Bronze Cross: Given for saving a life/attempting to save a life with risk to the candidate's own life Lifesaving Award recipients are recognized in a special way to be determined by GSOC on behalf of GSUSA. 	Application must be completed giving full details of the incident, accompanied by signed statements from the rescuer, the rescued person, and the witnesses (not more than three) and must be approved by GSOC before being submitted to GSUSA. Contact customercare@girlscoutsoc.org with the subject line "Lifesaving Awards" to request an application.	Application must be requested within 60 days of the incident and submitted within six months after the accident occurred.

Eligible Girl Scouts can purchase the official pin that represents 10 years of registered membership as a girl member from the council shop. Additionally, 10 Year Pins will be presented to Grads & Gold Award Girl Scouts in attendance who register and request the 10 Year Pin as part of their registration for the annual Green & Gold Celebration.	Girls/parents/troop leaders/service unit volunteers purchase the pin from the council shop. GSOC Gold Award Scholarship

Open to Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors, grades 9-12 9-12th grade Girl Scouts who have earned the highest award in Girl Scouting during the current Girl Scout membership year

Gold Award Girl Scouts who are high school seniors or recent high school graduates are eligible to apply. From 2025-2028, GSOC will provide scholarships to three finalists identified through the GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship Program.

Interested girls follow the guidelines to apply for the 2025 GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship Program.
Three finalists will be identified as part of the selection process.

Finalists will be recognized at the Green & Gold Celebration.

GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship

Open to Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors, grades 9-12

2025 recipients will receive a \$5,000 scholarship, an official award letter, and recognition in local and national Girl Scout promotions, including on www.girlscouts.org/goldawardclass

The GSUSA Gold Award Scholarship program recognizes the outstanding achievement of and provides financial support to one Gold Award Girl Scout per council. The scholarship is earned by a Girl Scout who completed a Gold Award project that demonstrated extraordinary leadership, measurable and sustainable impact, and that addressed an issue of national and/or global significance.

Gold Award Girl Scouts who are high school seniors or recent high school graduates can apply for the 2025 program. Specifically:

- current high school seniors who earned or will earn any time before April 1, 2025
- recent high school graduates who earned in their senior year after March 31, 2024

Councils select one nominee; GSUSA selects recipients; finalists are recognized at the Green & Gold Celebration.

Each Gold Award Girl Scout whose Gold Award Final Report has been approved in GoGold between **March 31. 2024 and April 1, 2025 i**s eligible to apply.

Notes on eligibility:

- Gold Award Girl Scouts who applied in a previous year are not eligible to re-apply.
- To be eligible, all Gold Award Girl Scouts must have their Final Report approved in GoGold within the eligibility date range.
- Gold Award Girl Scouts who are not yet in 12th grade will have the opportunity to apply in their senior year.

Girls complete the application.

Note to applicants:

The application collects basic demographics, confirms Gold Award status, collects a headshot photo and release form, and offers four essay prompts where Girl Scouts answer questions about their Gold Award.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is due on 2-4-6-8?

This deadline does not apply to Girl Awards.

In March 2024, we shifted to recognizing Adult Awards at the Annual Meeting. In efforts to align our Adult Recognition with our membership year, we need to change the <u>Adult Recognition Nominations</u> due date from February 4th at 6:08 PM (2-4-6-8) "Who Do We Appreciate" to November 11th (11-11), "Volunteers Make Our Wishes Come True."

How do I get my 10 Year Award? Bridge to Adult Award?

Grads & Gold Award Girl Scouts who plan to attend indicate the awards they are eligible to receive as part of their event registration for the annual Green & Gold Celebration. This includes Girl Scout 10 Year Award and Bridge to Adult Award. *Note: Girls not planning to attend can purchase pins in the council shop.*

What is the submission process for Girl Awards for Girl Scout Grads?

The online submission process for GSOC Girl Awards including the Juliette Low Spirit of Girl Scouting Award and the Outstanding Senior Girl Scout Recognition includes narrative statements and responses to be completed by the Grad Girl Scout. Interested Grads complete the GSOC Grad Girl Award Submission Form by March 1st and references* by March 10th as follows:

- Juliette Low Spirit of Girl Scouting Award three references (Girl Scout)
- Outstanding Senior Girl Scout Recognition three references (school, community, Girl Scout)

Girls should include at least one reference from a Girl Scout Troop Leader or other Girl Scout Adult.

All applicants will be notified of their status prior to the registration deadline for the annual Green & Gold Celebration.

What is the Green & Gold Celebration?

The annual Green & Gold Celebration recognizing Grad & Gold Award Girl Scouts is an opportunity for girls and two guests to celebrate their Girl Scout experience and be recognized! Annual Group Photos will be taken at this event and awards presented will include the Girl Scout 10 Year Award, recognition of Girl Scout Grads, Gold Award Girl Scouts, Bridge to Adult Awards, and GSOC Girl Awards. There will be photos, food, and fun at this special celebration for OC Girl Scouts!

GSOC is committed to girl achievement and invested in girl awards and recognition. Building on the success of the Grad & Gold Award Girl Scout Celebration started in 2020, we are excited to recognize Grads & Gold Award Girl Scouts at the annual Green & Gold Celebration.
