The Makerspace should always be supervised and lead by an adult. We want to encourage creativity and innovation, safely!

Makerspace Rules

- 1. <u>Use Resources Wisely</u>: Be mindful of materials and tools. Only take what you need to ensure all Girl Scouts have the opportunity to use this space.
- 2. <u>Respect Others and Their Work</u>: Always be considerate of fellow makers. Share tools and workspace, and encourage a positive, supportive environment for everyone.
- 3. <u>Safety First</u>: Always follow safety instructions when using tools and equipment. Never use tools or machines without proper training.
- 4. <u>Keep the Space Clean</u>: After you're done, clean up your area, put tools back in their proper place, and dispose of waste responsibly.
- 5. <u>Take Care of Tools and Equipment</u>: Handle all tools with care and report any damage or malfunctions immediately to a staff member.
- 6. <u>Be Creative and Experiment</u>: The Makerspace is for learning and trying new things! Don't be afraid to experiment and explore different techniques.
- 7. <u>Share Your Ideas</u>: Collaboration and sharing ideas help everyone grow. Discuss your projects, offer feedback, and learn from others.
