Who can join the Alliance?

The Girl Scout Gold Award Alliance is open to all members of the Gold Award family* **AND** supporters of the Girl Scouts' Highest Awards: Bronze, Silver, and Gold Award.

*Girl Scouts who earned the Gold Award, First Class, Curved Bar, Golden Eaglet, or Golden Eagle of Merit are a part of the Gold Award Girl Scout family.

What is the purpose of the Alliance?

The Gold Award Alliance exists to elevate Girl Scouts' Highest Awards: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Through ongoing efforts, members of the Alliance help GSOC to engage the Gold Award Family and supporters to contribute to increased program impact, girl and adult retention, and a culture of philanthropy.

How can I get involved as a member of the Alliance?

Advocate for and participate in activities to elevate the Girl Scouts' Highest Awards: the Bronze Award for Girl Scout Juniors in 4-5th grades, the Silver Award for Girl Scout Cadettes in 6-8th grades, and the Girl Scout Gold Award for Girl Scout Seniors in 9-10th grades and Girl Scout Ambassadors in 11-12th grades.

- Help to plan a Highest Awards ceremony to recognize girls in your service unit/region.
- Team up with staff to coordinate City Council recognition for Gold Award Girl Scouts in your city.
- Become a council trainer for the Bronze, Silver, or Gold Award.
- Be a Troop/Group Volunteer or Project Advisor for a Girl Scout in your community.
- Become a member of the Girl Scout Gold Award Support Team to support girls who “go gold.”

☐ Attend Events

- Attend a Highest Awards ceremony to recognize girls in your community.
- Participate in the annual GSOC Recognition Event, view Gold Award project displays and learn how OC Gold Award Girl Scouts are tackling issues such as poverty, sustainability, and abuse.
- Be a spokesperson for Girl Scouts in your personal and professional life– with family and friends, community groups, organizations or businesses, tell others about what Girl Scouts means to you, how girls change the world through the Highest Awards, and ask them to support Girl Scouts.
