STEM Expo, Robotics, and More



In mid-October, our 7th annual STEM Expo, organized by Girl Scouts of Orange County's STEM Patrol volunteers and <u>STEM Consortium</u>, proved to be one of the most compelling events of the year. Over 250 girls enjoyed hands-on experience alongside inspiring professionals from the fields of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).

Several elected representatives including U.S. Congressman Lou Correa, State Senator Dave Min, Assembly member Cottie Petrie-Norris, Irvine Mayor Farrah Khan, and Irvine Councilmember Larry Agran kicked off the afternoon with inspiring comments. Later, girls launched rockets with Raytheon, built "Raspberry Pi" computers with Broadcom Foundation, and learned about circuits with the Society of Women Engineers.

Earlier in October, we hosted a mock tournament for robotics teams preparing for the <u>FIRST Lego League</u> competition in November. Thanks to generous support from Muff and Pete Tennyson and the Girl Scouts of Orange County <u>STEM Consortium</u>, girls engaged in hands-on STEM activities while using their imaginations and having fun. Guided by professional mentors, the teams research real-world problems and develop a solution by designing, building, and programming a robot.

Indeed, within the context of the <u>Girl Scout Leadership Experience</u>, our programs offer girls opportunities to combine STEM learning with leadership development, growth mindset development, and so many other skills. In Girl Scouts, our flexible, informal environment supports exploration and experimentation and is proven to increase girls' <u>interest</u> in STEM, increase girls' <u>confidence</u> in their STEMrelated abilities, <u>educate</u> girls about STEM careers, and <u>expose</u> girls to STEM professionals at an early age. This is a huge WIN for our entire community as prime the pipeline for our future STEM leaders.

Argyros Girl Scout Leadership Center: 5 Years of Inspiring Girls



Five years ago, Girl Scouts of Orange County (GSOC) opened the Argyros Girl Scout Leadership Center (GLSC) in Newport Beach as a hub for Girl Scout STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) programs. Since then, thousands of girls have participated in INSPIRE, GSOC's signature interactive multimedia program, exploring exciting 21st

Century careers and learning how to take-action on issues they care about, while developing an understanding of the importance and relevance of STEM in their everyday lives. And many more girls have visited the GLSC to create lifelong memories – kayaking from the bayfront property, toasting s'mores on the sprawling patio, and participating in fun water and sand activities on Newport Beach's beautiful Balboa Peninsula.

Congratulations to Emily Tran for being our council's Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) Gold Award Scholarship recipient! Emily's Girl Scout Gold Award project focused on helping girls have free and sufficient access to menstrual products. She secured pad and tampon dispensers for 27 Title 1 schools across California and got bill AB-367 approved by Gov. Gavin

Newsom. The bill requires California public schools (grades six through 12) to provide free menstrual hygiene products for their students. Emily's heart, vision, and drive will have a sustainable impact. She is now attending Stanford University and we can't wait to see what Emily does next!
