
Silver Award Girl Scouts Build Bridges of Understanding

Girl Scouts is for Every Girl - Jamboree Housing Troop 8912



Troop 8912 out of Jamboree Housing in Brea formed in February 2020. For many of the girls, this was their first time learning about Girl Scouts; but by the end of the first

troop meeting, there was a stack of enrollment forms from girls who wanted to have fun and make friends—and parents who wanted their daughters to have the opportunity to develop skills that prepare their girls for a lifetime of leadership, adventure and success. Now with several meetings under their sashes, the troop, ranging in age from 5-12, has earned their detective badge and studied the stars as part of earning their space science badge. These go-getters are already making a difference and recently made blankets for a local animal shelter and hygiene kits for people facing homelessness. The girls have continued to meet virtually during the pandemic and learned about chemistry by making slime and elephant toothpaste!

To date, Girl Scouts of Orange County has established nine community partnerships through its <u>All Girl Initiative</u> to serve 1,000 girls across Orange County. Thanks to incredible partners like Jamboree Housing, we are expanding the ways Orange County girls can participate in Girl Scouts, so *every* girl from *every* social, cultural, economic and developmental sphere can experience the life-changing benefits Girl Scouts provides.

Congratulations 2020 Cookie Entrepreneurs!



It is always important to celebrate accomplishments. With your support, girls participating in the 2020 Cookie Program, which ended just prior to the pandemic, sold an incredible 2,555,904 packages of cookies in six weeks and increased their sales from the prior year by 64,000+ packages of cookies council wide! A total of 39,204 packages of cookies were donated to local military and foodbanks, and the average troop earned \$1,697 to fund amazing adventures chosen by their girls.

Three Girl Scouts sold more than 5K packages each and are headed to New York in 2021 with GSOC CEO Vikki Shepp. These stellar sellers are: **Kara from Troop 8561 in Irvine, Hailey from Troop 3115 in Anaheim, and Ashley from Troop 2509 in Rancho Santa Margarita! Girl Scout Ambassador Alanah J.** from Troop 486 in Irvine will be traveling with them as Girl Scouts of Orange County's Lifetime Top Seller – the first Orange County Girl Scout to reach the 40,000+ Club by selling 42,154 packages over her twelve years in Girl Scouts!
