
January 28 in Orange County).

Girl Scouts Celebrates National Financial Planning



October was National Financial Planning Month - a month dedicated to creating a financial plan or reviewing an existing one. Personal financial planning is essential to everyone, regardless of age or income. This year, nearly 800 Girl Scouts participated in Financial Planning Month, hosted by volunteers from eight local organizations: Union Bank, Bank of America, US Bank, WISE, Martlet Asset Management, LLC, PIMCO, Morgan Stanley, and VicTree Financial LLC. Together, over 30 hours of financial education took place via Zoom calls. Many thanks to our program providers for their great support of Girl Scouts of Orange County's Financial Planning Month and commitment to providing local girls opportunities to learn and grow.

The GSOC STEM Consortium Builds Tomorrow's STEM Leaders



Girl Scouts all across Orange County have been busy in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). October marked the 5th annual (and first virtual) GSOC STEM Expo, created by GSOC's Volunteer STEM Patrol in partnership with Cal State Fullerton. Nearly 200 Juniors and Cadettes participated in this hands-on STEM event and spent the afternoon having fun with bridge and tower building, marshmallow cannon and catapult creations, coding, astronomy, biology, and more exciting activities led by 23 exhibitors! STEM Patrol volunteers also led our last virtual Coding for Good session in October, part of a five-week series that taught 40 girls to code an app for their phones. In November, 30 Girl Scout Brownies participated in Bunny Bots! Leap Bot Design Challenge and learned about energy, force, and other engineering concepts while building bouncing bunny toys and testing how high they could jump. Rounding out the year in December, Girl Scout Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors gathered virtually and built model rockets under the instruction of engineers from GSOC's STEM Patrol, Northrop Grumman, and Raytheon. Meanwhile, GSOC's five FIRST Lego League teams have been meeting virtually to navigate robotics. Participating Girl Scouts are also preparing for their virtual mock tournament in January and local qualifying tournament in February.

Thanks to the generosity of **STEM Consortium** sponsors, OC Girl Scouts are exploring Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math every year and recognizing the importance and power of STEM for their future success.
